Think critically about the things you see online



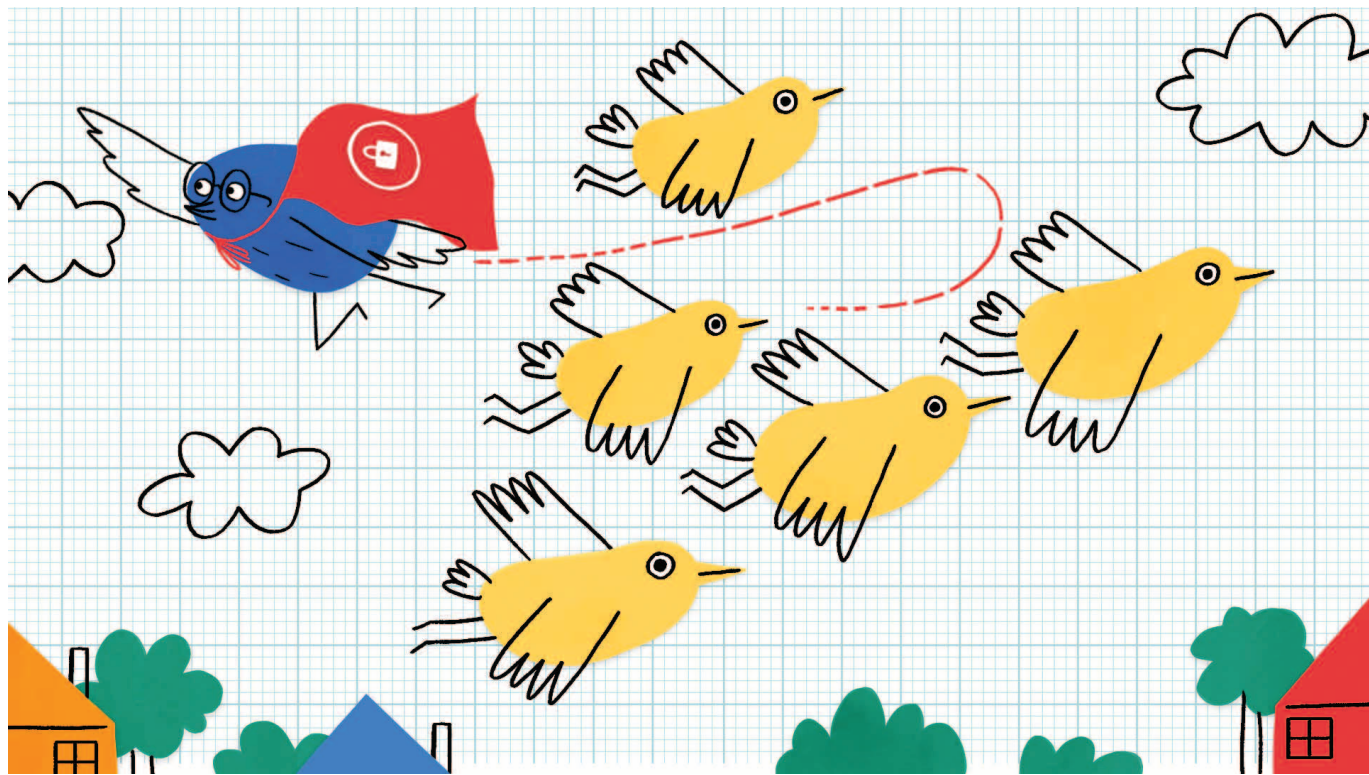




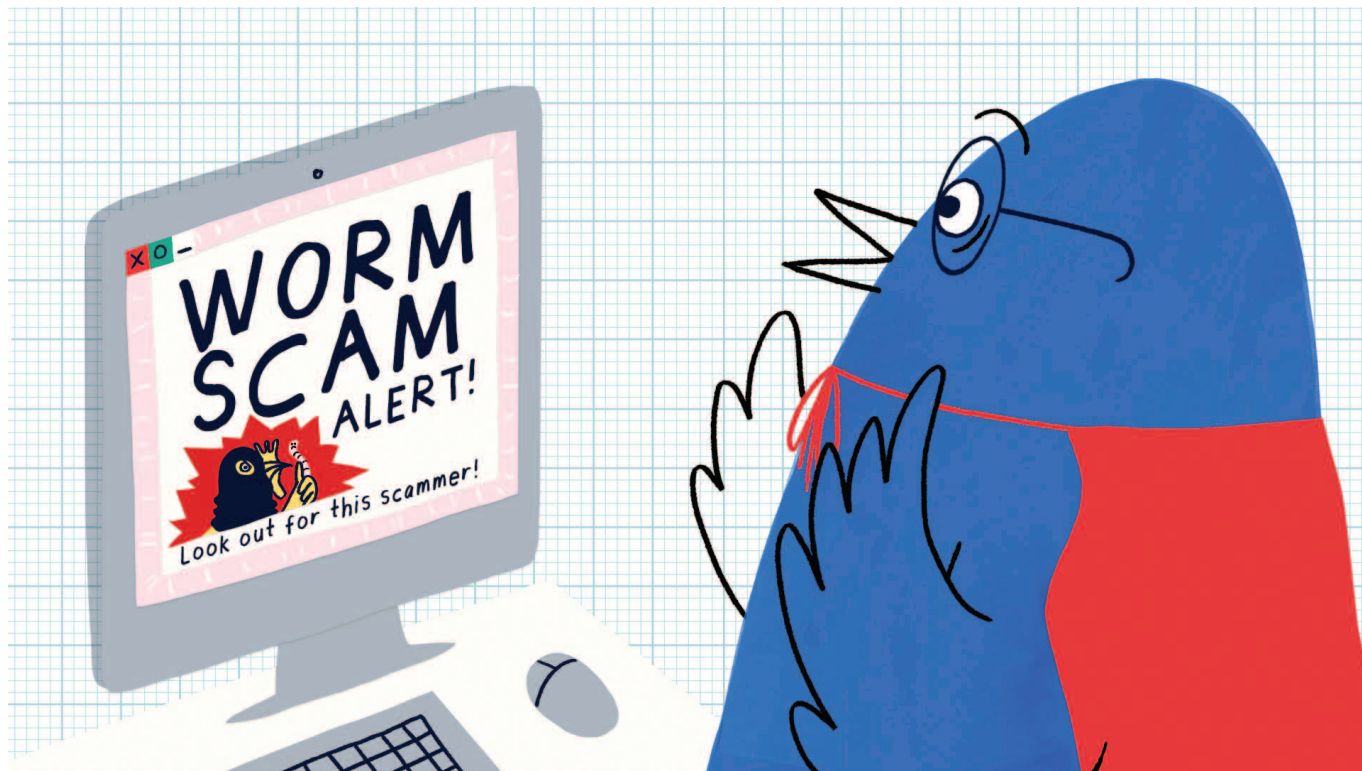

you need to be an independent thinker.

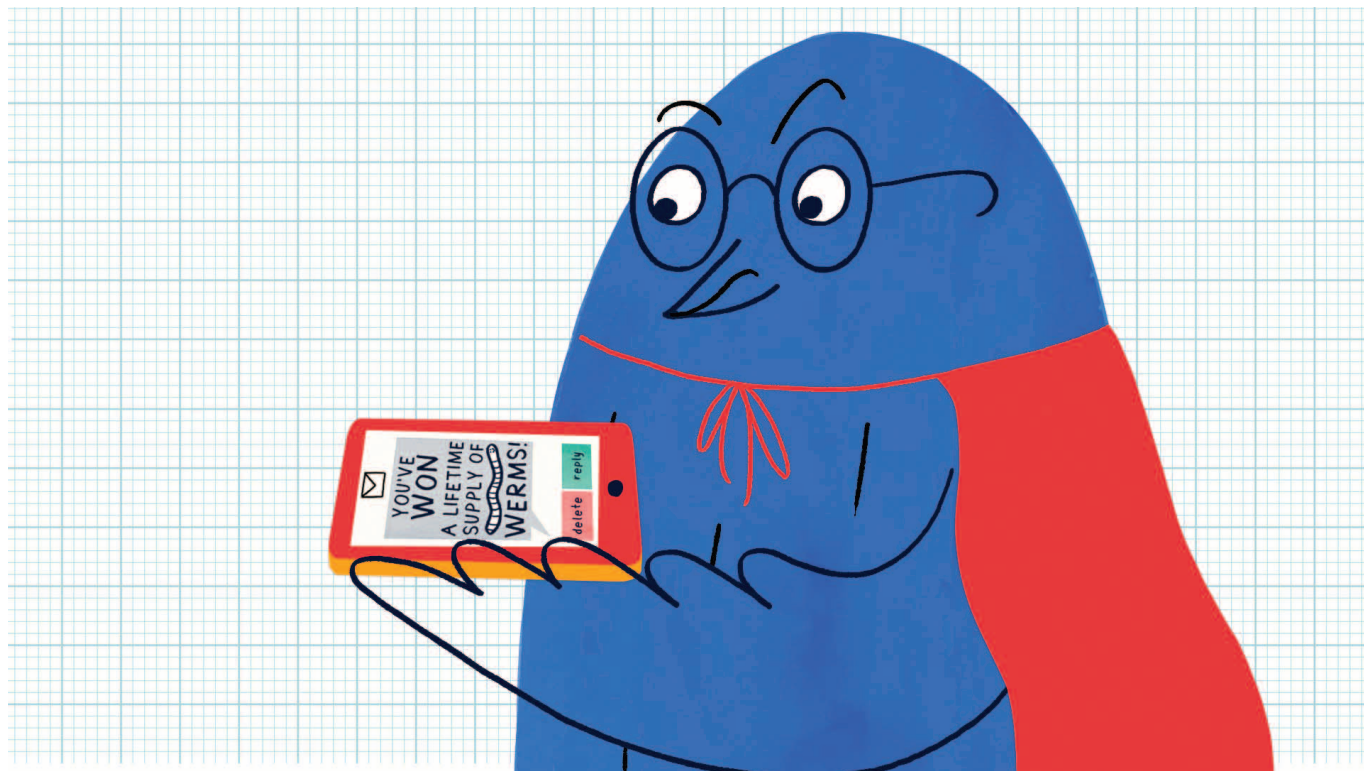


Even armed with information from different sources,
